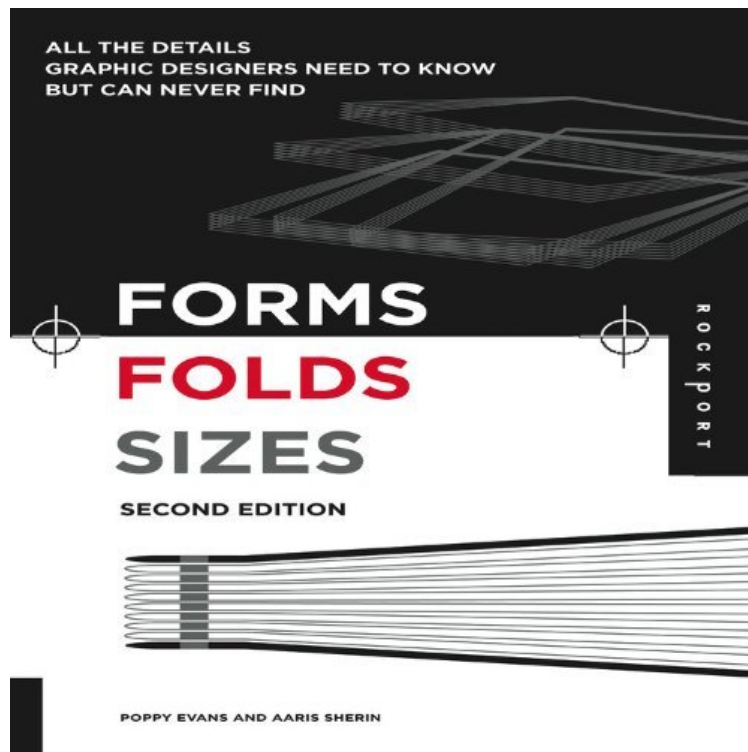

I've included a video of things to help you make a decision on your purchase because I can see why the ebook might be a disappointment if you don't know certain things in advance.If you need the following aspects of the book to be accurate, you should buy the paper book:\* COLOR - even if the publisher makes an update to the ebook (which I would recommend) the color references in this book will not be a perfectly accurate representation due to color calibration of electronic devices. Right now, even on a kindle fire, the color pages are black and white and useless.\* RESOLUTION - if you need the resolution reference information in this book, there is nothing that the publisher can do to make these accurate on any kindle. This is simply where there's a technical impossibility on an electronic device over paper.\* FONT SIZE - this is a very small portion of the book but if you need a point size reference, please do not rely on the ebook for this. I've shown a side by side in the video.NOTE ON KINDLE MODELS that might affect your decision: If your Kindle is not

touch screen, you should probably consider getting the paper version as well. Many of the image references need to be zoomed in on which is something that's easier on the touch screen models than on the traditional button based kindle devices. All of this aside, this is still an excellent reference even as an ebook for pretty much every other section of the book. As I flipped through, I was constantly amazed at how much useful information I was finding. For me, the best parts are about everything to do with printing: paper sizes kinds, folding templates for folders, envelopes, packages, binding methods, printing techniques, etc. There's a large CMYK process "color finder" section at the back as well as a glossary of terms. No, of course it's not exhaustive, but they did a great job of fitting as much information as possible within a book of practical size.
