good. The best part is that they are playable, perhaps intermediate - advanced, but still sound great. So many times it happens that to have a great sounding arrangement of say, 'All Blues' you have to have the technique of a monster. The simplified arrangements don't cut it? But these are not simplified arrangements. They are perfectly performable tunes. The arrangements have been very cleverly done so that they sound complete without the need of a gargantuan technique. That is not to say you won't be challenged. These pieces aren't necessarily easy, just not overly complex. I am an advanced intermediate player and I find arrangements by Earl Hines for instance, just that bit too hard. I get frustrated and disappointed when the good sounds I want to play are out of reach. I would pay the price of the book for any one of the arrangements within. I think they are just that good.
